

INDIGENOUS RELATIONS COMMITMENT STATEMENT

TransCanada's policies and practices for engagement and consultation with Indigenous Peoples are informed by our corporate values of Safety, Integrity, Responsibility and Collaboration, conform with all applicable laws and regulations, and respect the spirit and intent of the <u>United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples</u> (UNDRIP), its guiding principles and other international and national law. TransCanada recognizes and honours the rights and interests of Indigenous Groups in the jurisdictions where the Company conducts business activities. TransCanada respects that Indigenous Peoples have a collective attachment to the lands and resources that may be associated with the Company's business activities and often have separate organizational and governance structures, as well as political institutions from those of the jurisdictions they fall under.

In alignment with our corporate values, TransCanada is committed to developing long-term mutually beneficial relationships with Indigenous Groups in support of Company's business and Corporate Social Responsibility objectives across Canada, the United States, and Mexico. TransCanada works collaboratively with Indigenous Groups based on the provisions set forth by international and national law, to achieve regulatory certainty and maintain access to land, while supporting Indigenous Groups' capacity-building initiatives and participation in economic opportunities.

To meet those commitments, the following principles guide TransCanada's relations with Indigenous Groups:

- We recognize the unique connection Indigenous Peoples have to the land, resources, and their community governance;
- We ensure meaningful and respectful engagement with Indigenous Peoples and governmental authorities, as early as possible, using a principled approach and based on international and national law;
- We strive to achieve regulatory certainty using a pragmatic approach in the jurisdiction where we are building or operating; and
- We build innovative project strategies, reflecting engagement and regulatory outcomes, that are defensible, commercially reasonable, and community led.
